

Clues

1. The swimmer competed in the longest time period and won 31 of the total 102 medals, but no Bronze.
2. Tom won 23 of the 53 Gold medals, and two Bronze medals fewer than the rower.
3. June won 33 medals, including 15 Silver and 3 Bronze in the shortest time period.
4. The runner won 8 more Gold medals than each of the two other competitors.
