#### The Times They Are Changing

We can rightly say, "These are changing times." True, but in fact all times are constantly changing. When rock and roll came on the scene in the 1950s many parents believed and said it would destroy our country. When the 1960s rolled in with the Beetles and the British invasion of bands, many people shook their heads and criticized the hippies, guys with shoulder length hair, and girls with hip-hugger, bell-bottom jeans or short miniskirts. The question is not whether there will be change but how we will respond to the changes in the world and here in the USA. One way to maintain hope and a faithful attitude is to meditate on scripture. Scripture is food for the spirit that nourishes us and helps us face challenges. I have selected seven scriptures one for each day for one week. Reading scripture and committing, especially meaningful scripture to memory, will help us face changing times and situations. If we have no scripture for a week, it makes all of us weak. I pray that as we share these scriptures together that God will fill us with new confidence to accept and to thrive in these changing times.

#### Here are the seven scriptures I selected to feed our souls.

Romans 12:1-2, "Do not conform to the pattern of this world but be transformed by the renewing of your mind."

James 1:17, "Every good gift is from above, coming down from the Father of heavenly lights, who does not change like shifting shadows."

Psalm 18:2, "The Lord is my rock, my fortress and my deliverer. My God is my rock, in whom I take refuge, my shield and the horn of my salvation, my stronghold."

Philippians 4:6-7, "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving and your minds in Christ Jesus." press your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus."

2 Corinthians 4:16, "Therefore do not lose heart. Though outwardly we are wasting away, yet inwardly we are being renewed day by day. For our lights and momentary troubles are achieving for us an eternal glory that far outweighs them all. So, we do not keep our eyes on what is seen, but on what is unseen, since what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal."

Lamentations 3:21-23, "Yet this I call to mind and therefore I have hope: because of the Lord's great love we are not consumed for his compassions never fail. They are new every morning: great is your faithfulness."

Isaiah 43:18-19, "Remember not the former things, nor consider the things of old. Behold, I am doing a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert."

One of the best pieces of advice anyone has given me is to stop spending time in the past, it's over. Stop spending time worrying about the future it may or may not be anything like our worrying. If we want to grow in faith, we must meet God in the present. The present is the only time and place we can meet God.

We have been doing some work in the Old Testament these last few months. Reading again of Moses' conversation with God, where Moses asked God what Moses should say if the Pharoah asked Moses to tell him the name of his Moses' God; God said, "Tell him my name is I AM." I AM is present tense, God is here and now every day with us. If we want a closer walk with the Lord, we must live today, that's the only time and place we can connect with God. May the Lord of all Creation meet us today and bless us with the Peace, love, and joy of God. Amen.
