BECOMING

"Dear friends, now we are children of God, and what we will be, has not yet been made known. But we know that when God appears, we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is." 1 John 3:2 (NIV)

The theme of Annual Conference 2022 was **<u>BECOMING</u>**. Each of our worship services centered around this theme. Friday morning was Becoming More Like Jesus Christ. Friday afternoon was Becoming Community. Saturday morning was Becoming Spirit Filled. We were reminded that we need to become a beloved community. Beloved is to be loved. Fellowship matters. Growth requires faith. We need to practice Christian friendship and become a community of support. We need to practice that kind of support. One example of this is that it was announced that we have already raised a quarter million dollars for Ukraine. Praise God! To become spirit filled we need to become spiritual so that we can reach out to those who are not. The language of grace is the language of the Holy Spirit. We have to show acceptance, love, and grace to love others as God loves us.

I know the above paragraph sounds like a lot of rambling, but they are ideas that I wrote down to remember as the conference took place.

During the day and a half, we heard the reports of the many conference committees who work tirelessly all year long. Many of you know that our yearly conference was held for many years at Lakeside, Ohio. We have been online for two years because of Covid. One of these committees has researched other sites and it was announced that in 2023 it will be held at Otterbein University.

We also carried out the work of the conference by voting on several recommendations, most of which were approved. Recommendation #1 dealt with structure, procedure and annual conference rules and policies. It passed. Recommendation #2 dealt with the 2023 budget. It passed. It was reported that the conference is financially sound at this time. Recommendation #3 dealt with the board of pensions and health care. It passed. Recommendation #4 dealt with equitable compensation and established suggested minimum salaries for pastors. It passed. Recommendation #5 dealt with reducing the number of districts in the conference taking them to 6 in July 2023. It passed. Recommendation #6 dealt with an amicable separation of churches wishing to leave the annual conference. It passed. Recommendation #7 was titled, "Call to West Ohio Annual Conference to Recognize and Validate Persons' Calls to Ordination Without Prejudice Toward Sexual Orientation or Gender Identity." This did not pass. Recommendation #8 dealt with the path for a congregation to take to separate from West Ohio. A vote was not taken on this matter as the Bishop was asked to check on the legalities of some of this recommendation.

The Becoming theme was summarized in the Bishop Palmer's Episcopal Address.

Who do I want to become? Who do we want to become as a church? We must keep Jesus at the center of who we are. We must follow a path of nonviolence and peace in our lives.

Who does Grace Church want to become as we grow in our faith?

It was an honor to represent Grace Church again at conference.
